

TipLites Balloon Instructions

TipLites are shipped with balloons and the LED modules, fully assembled and ready to use right out of the package. With the LED suspended from the top of the balloon TipLites appear brighter at the bottom because the balloon light points down.

Inflate the balloon:

Fill the balloon manually, with Helium, or Compressed Air. Tie off the balloon to prevent air from leaking out. The standard neck also works with all balloon cup holders and ties used with regular balloons.

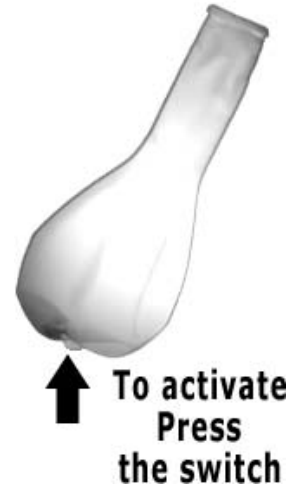
Operation:

The switch is located in the small square projecting from the top of the balloon. Press once for Fast Blink, again for Slow Blink, and a third time for Constant On.

Do not use your fingernail or sharp objects that could pierce the balloon.

Some lights are not working:

1. Take the unit apart by turning the balloon inside out.
2. (Be careful not to rip the balloon)
3. Remove the batteries by sliding them from the battery holder.
4. (Notice the flat part with the writing should face up from the LED module)
5. Check to see if anything is obviously broken or cracked or if there might not be a good electrical connection.
6. Check to make sure your batteries are good by trying them in a different light or replace the batteries with some from a working one.
7. Reassemble the unit and turn the balloon right side out.



If you are still having problems:

If the batteries are not making contact somewhere a little playing around with battery placement may be required. Try rearranging them or turning them within the battery holder.

If all else fails:

In the rare event you do get a defective unit that still does not work after trying everything above, contact us for instructions on getting a replacement or for further ideas.

As with any product, if you absolutely need a certain number of lights, buy a few extras just in case a backup is needed. It's a cheap insurance policy and you can always use the extras somewhere!

Batteries:

Contains three (2) LR921 button cell batteries.



CHOKING HAZARD - Children under 8 yrs can choke or suffocate on deflated or broken balloons. Adult supervision required. Keep deflated balloons from children. Discard broken balloons at once.
